Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee

The San Diego Taxpayers Educational Foundation gave the district's Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee high scores for its transparency and the accessibility of information that makes it possible for taxpayers to assess the information of school facility bond programs. Of the 23 school districts that were surveyed, GCCCD received one of the highest scores (24 out of 25 points possible). The taxpayers organization reviewed the information that was available on the oversight committees' websites, including committee bylaws, member information, meeting minutes, agendas, and annual reports. Grossmont College Arts & Communication Complex – Teaching & Performance Theater



The Performing Arts Complex at Grossmont College will include a new 390-seat theater, with a full stage, orchestra pit and balcony. Bids were opened in June and the bid analysis is ongoing. Upon completion of the analysis, program/project management will provide recommendations and discuss paths forward with the District and College.

Grossmont College Science, Math and Career Tech Complex Building 31 Renovation

The first phase of the Science, Math and Career Tech Complex is the renovation of Building 31. Plans and specifications were submitted to the Division of the State Architect (DSA), which is expected to take up to nine months. DSA is a part of the Department of General Services (DGS), which by law has central overall responsibility, duties, functions, and powers related to design and construction in state government. Construction is anticipated to begin in January 2018.

Cuyamaca College Ornamental Horticulture Complex



The scope of work for this project includes renovation of the existing Ornamental Horticulture Complex. The building will provide classrooms, new greenhouses, outdoor instructional spaces and storage buildings. Design is ongoing and submission to DSA is anticipated for December 2017.

Cuyamaca College Student Services & Administration



This project includes the construction of a Student Services facility with a Veteran Support Center. Design is ongoing and in the schematic phase. Schematic design is the work to define the size, flow and functionality of the space. The budget is finalized at this stage.
